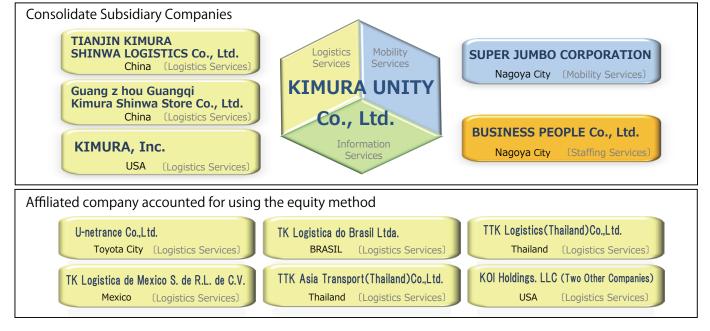

Looking back on FY2024

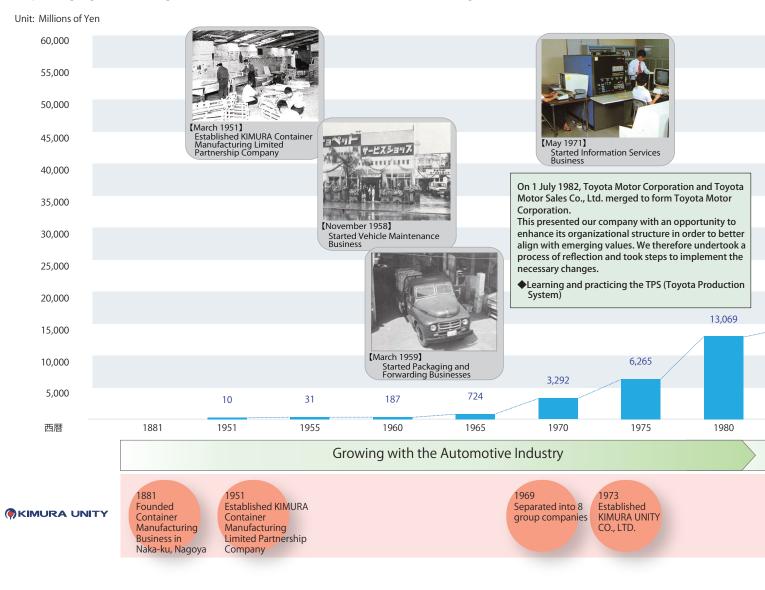

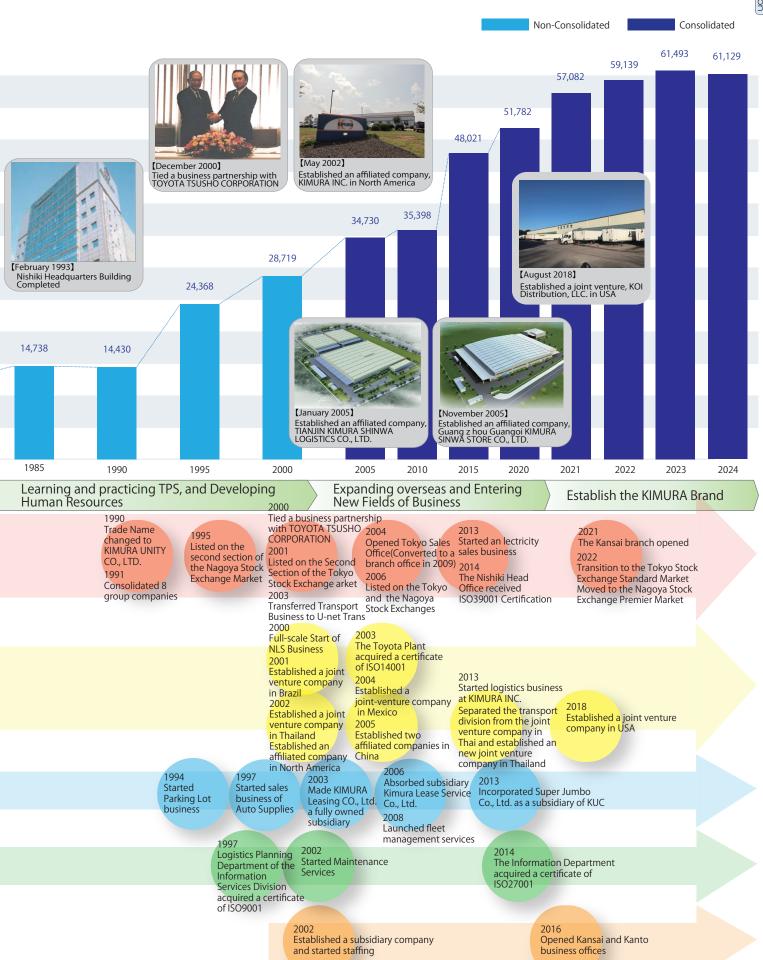

BUSINESS OVERVIEW (The Origin of Each Business)

LOGISTICS SERVICES BUSINESS





Going back over the history of our company, we always come to our root back in 1881, when the founder started a box manufacturing business engaged in supplying wooden boxes mainly for textile wholesale companies. In 1950, we had an encounter with Toyota Motor Corporation (Currently TOYOTA MOTOR CORPORATION), and that was the impetus for us to start delivering wooden boxes for auto parts. In 1952, we established KIMURA BOX Limited Partnership Company. It was the expertise and the spirit of manufacturing that our forerunners had developed sharing among them in the initial period development, which have been inherited as our corporate DNA to this day. With the rise of corrugated cardboard, which took the place of wooden boxes, we started a packaging business in line with a transport business as our new business in 1959. This business has grown to be a logistics business, currently the main pillar of ours. Thanks to kind support and understanding of our stakeholders, we succeeded in expanding business overseas. In 2000, we began 3PL, which was not confined to the automotive industry but entered into non-automotive industries (currently NLS business), and has expended and grown on a large scale.

*Third-party logistics, or 3PL, is a system where an outside organization provides logistics services in general to companies that need inventory management and distribution.

MOBILITY SERVICES BUSINESS





During the changing period of declining wooden box needs, we established a totally different business of car servicing and maintenance under the name of "TOYOPET Service Shop" in 1958, in an effort to find a way out of the wooden box business, which lasted from its foundation. We also made an important decision to start in the same year. That is to initiate an insurance agent business with the view to being of help for the sake of customers against risks in the event of traffic accidents. We were encouraged by our philosophy: "It takes buyer's view to make sales." In 1973, due to the growing interest in leasing service by customers, we started a car leasing business, and subsequently, we also started the upstream business of car sales business in 1976. Following that event, we began the sales of car supplies and accessories in1997, thus cementing the foundation of the total car services, the result of which formed the Mobility Services Business of today.

The essence of business always lies in the philosophy, "It takes buyer's view to make sales."

With the essential value of business kept in mind, we always give considerations with buyer's view and put the essence into practice in our business conduct. This has been always true for other sales activities.

INFORMATION SERVICES BUSINESS



The roots of Information Services Business dates back to the time when we introduced a computer (IBM S/3-10) in1971, mainly for the in-house sales management and salary calculation.

Later, we began to undertake entrusted calculation business from outside, leading us to the currently the main business, of logistics systems development alongside in-site training and guidance focused on the information areas. In so doing, we have been taking an important part for Toyota Sales Company (Currently TOYOTA MOTOR CORPORATION) in an area of overseas projects.

STAFFING SERVICES BUSINESS



Established as an affiliated company under the name of "Business People Co., Ltd." in 2002, we began staffing services so as to meet a wide variety of demands on human resources. We were expanding our scale of business steadily. However, due to the shrinkage of the temporary staffing market caused by the Lehman Shock, we turned our direction, and are now in the process of going toward promoting the structural reform of business focused on the areas of business contracting, recruitment services and human resource development through education and training enriched in contents focused on the market needs.

BUSINESS OVERVIEW (at Present)



We provide high-quality services by utilizing our know-how and advanced skills we have accumulated and developed as a logistics partner for major automobile manufacturers. The scope of business includes all areas of logistics business such as planning of logistics center and operation to Kaizen (improvement) of logistics centers not to mention, arranging transportation. We also design and manufacture logistics equipment and incidental equipment such as dollies, carts and storage equipment fit for the needs of customers.

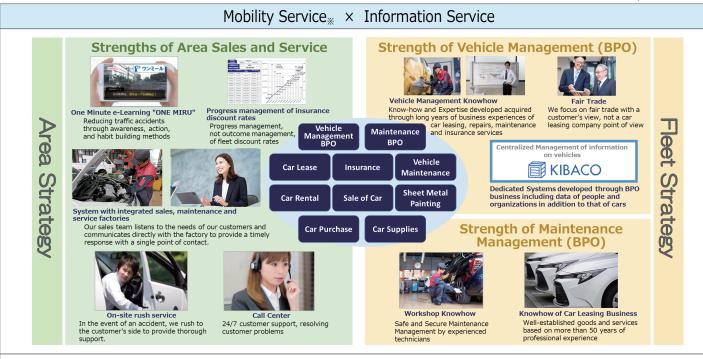

EPISODE: "IT TAKES A BUYER'S VIEW TO MAKE SALES"

(Excerpt from a story "Today makes Tomorrow" ---KIMURA UNITY CENNTENIAL HISTORY OF PROGRESS)

We exist for the benefit of customers is the corporate DNA handed down through generations since its foundation of KIMURA UNITY.

"Being of help with the view of customers" has always been our mindset throughout our history, we will continue to be of service with this basic attitude of "It takes a buy's view to make sales."

©The Beginning of the Vehicle Maintenance Business (1958)

At the time, we were experiencing some frustration and distrust from our customers as a repair shop, and we were facing more demands for repairs than we could handle.

When we decided to start a vehicle maintenance business, we were aware of the general complaints about repair shops at the time. We came to understand that addressing these customer needs was essential for the future of our maintenance business. We addressed each issue methodically, tackling them one by one. Consequently, we have experienced significant growth in our customer base.



©The Beginning of the Packaging and Transportation Business (1959)

This happened long ago when some transport company was working packaging "on-vehicle tools for a car" in the auto parts warehouse on the premises of a major automobile sales company. Those packaged sets were loaded on tracks for shipping to a car assembly plant in the Kanto District of the car sales company. It took approximately 5 to 7 days to finish the whole process of all those logistic operations in those days. By chance, then President of ours was spoken to and asked by manager of the auto sales company if he was interested in doing the job by any chance. He took it as a great and challenging opportunity to be of help to customers. In no time without hesitation, President decided to live up to the expectation of the customer. We completed the packaging operation of on-vehicle tools by 4:30 P.M. after receiving those parts for

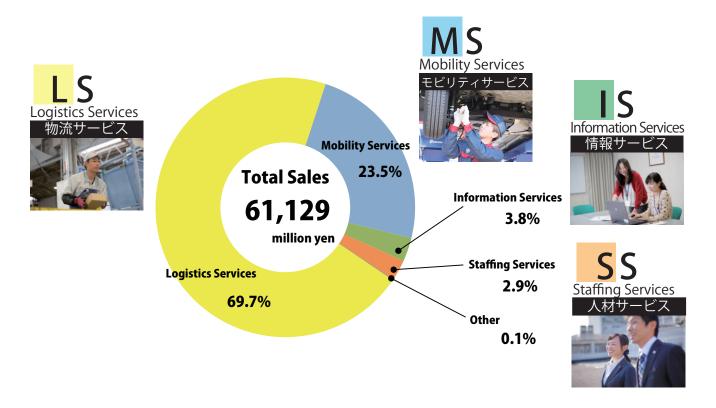
packaging at 1 P.M. on the same day. Following that, we immediately loaded all the sets packaged on tracks, and shipped for the assembly plant in the Kanto District. The truck ran all through the night for the destination by way of TOKAI-DO, an arterial road, and arrived at the main entrance of the assembly plant before 9 o'clock A.M. the next morning, and waited for the opening of the gate. Upon completing the delivery all sets of on-vehicle parts without fail, our members cleaned up the worksite with the cleaning tools and equipment they took with them. It was not the speed of operation which was rated, but the sincere attitude of our team members responding to the needs of the customer in the most natural manners with fresh sensitivity and active intelligence. Highly efficient and impeccable performance meeting the needs of customers gained the confidence of the Auto Sales Company, which brought us many future orders as a designated contractor for the Auto Sales Company.

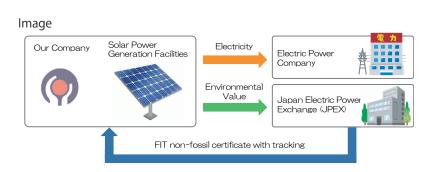


Our group is exploring ways to strengthen its environmental initiatives with the goal of contributing to a sustainable society. We have identified "contributing to the resolution of global environmental issues" as an environmental materiality, and we are aiming to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050, with a target of reducing CO₂ emissions by 50% by 2030 (compared to 2018 levels).

 Use electricity derived from renewable energy sources with added environmental value from our solar power generation facilities

We procure renewable energy for our brand by buying tracking-enabled, non-fossil FIT certificates for our solar power generation facilities in Kamioka, Inuyama, APR Inazawa, and Nagoya-Kita.

Ocontribute to the Environment by introducing Green Power

Our group has purchased green power certificates through Japan Natural Energy Co., Ltd. The purchased green power certificates will be allocated to cover a portion of our electricity usage (approximately 17%) at each of our locations from April 2024 to March 2025, and will be used to reduce environmental impact.

- Non-fossil value: Power Generation Amount: 1,000,000 kWh
- Power generation method: Natural ENERGY POWER Generation (hydropower generation)

****What is the Green Power Certification System?**

Green power refers to electricity generated from natural energy sources such as solar, wind, biomass, hydropower, and geothermal energy. This energy source is not concerned with resource depletion, emits minimal greenhouse gas during power generation, and is renewable, resulting in a negligible environmental impact.

The Green Power Certificate System is a program in which the environmental added value of electricity generated from natural energy sources is traded in the form of "Clean Power Certificates" by certificate-issuing businesses. These businesses obtain certification from a third-party certification body (Japan Quality Organization, a general incorporated foundation).

○ Climate Change Risk and Response



The Group have established a Sustainability Committee, chaired by the president in order to respond not only to physical risks such as wind and flood damage caused by climate change, but also respond to transitional risks such as various systems and business environments to curb climate change. We control and promote environmental responses through the business activities of each division of our group.

We are promoting carbon initiatives in order to mitigate climate change with the focus on "energy saving" by promoting the switch to equipment with high environmental performance, the use of renewable energy, raising awareness of energy conservation during operation, side by side improving the environmental performance by renovating existing properties.

♦ Realization of a Recycling-oriented Society



In order to effectively use limited resources and to realize a recycling-oriented society, we are eliminating and/or streamlining packaging materials, using materials with low environmental impact, reducing the amount of product materials used, while decreasing waste through thorough separation.

We are working on the effective use of resources, such as product design that is easy to recycle and reuse.

♦ Chemical Substance Management



The paints and thinners used in the painting operations for containers and fixtures as well as auto servicing and mobile maintenance work contain substances subject to notification by PRTR Law (Pollutant Release and Transfer Register Law). We monitor and measure the volume and quantity of emissions from our facilities into the atmosphere, etc., which is to be report to the government.

We established the "Product Chemical Substance Management Procedures," which stipulates management procedures for chemical substances contained in products in Japan and overseas, to strengthen chemical substance management at our company and related partner companies, and to ensure "non-use of prohibited substances in accordance with relevant laws and regulations in Japan and overseas, complied with industry standards, and customer requirements."

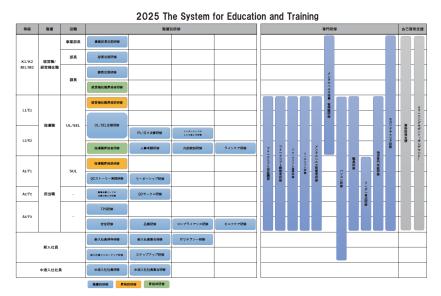

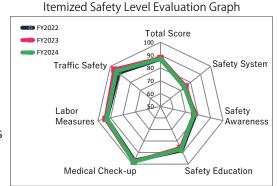


- Our group has a specialized department, the SQ (Safety & Quality) Management Department, which promotes safety and quality. The SQ Management Department collaborates closely with on-site personnel at operational sites to gather feedback from workers and management while performing the work, and connects this feedback to activities aimed at improvement and prevention. Through this and other initiatives, the department is committed to achieving a workplace accident-free environment. Furthermore, in the event of an accident or property damage at a workplace, the SQ staff member collaborates with on-site personnel to prevent recurrence and disseminates best practices throughout the company, thereby enhancing safety.
- We conduct a "Safety and Health Awareness Survey" biannually, reaching all employees within our group. By sharing the results, we aim to promote safe behavior and enhance safety awareness in the workplace.
- We conduct a "Safety Level Survey" for our partner companies on an annual basis. We then provide feedback on the survey results and collaborate with our partner companies to further enhance their safety levels.

Activities to improve Safety Levels

We conduct a "Safety Level Survey" of our business partners on an annual basis. Following the survey, we offer feedback on the results and collaborate to support continued improvements in safety levels. In fiscal 2024, we surveyed 119 companies, and the overall average score was 87 points (out of 100), down one point from last year.

The average score decreased due to an increase in new business partners, but we will continue to follow up regularly to ensure that we can improve our level in the future.



Creating Healthy Work Environment



- We are dedicated to cultivating a conducive work environment that fosters both health and productivity among our employees. This commitment is embodied in our comprehensive health and safety program, which encompasses regular health checks upon arrival and departure, prompt reporting of injuries or illnesses, and measures to mitigate the impact of extreme heat at our facilities.
- To provide systematic and continuous care for mental health and enable each employee to lead a healthy and vibrant social life, we have opened a "Mental Health Desk" since fiscal 2009. We are working to create an environment that can alleviate the mental burden as much as possible.
- We also prioritize the prevention of mental health issues by having counselors and mental health staff make regular on-site visits to gather employees' honest opinions and report them to top management. In addition, we are continuously developing mental health training programs with the objective of enhancing self-care and the quality of care provided by managers and supervisors. We also maintain a permanent information sharing page with the assistance of in-house counselors.

Improving Health Management and Work Environment

We are promoting the following systems and various activities as part of our "employee health management and work environment improvement" so that employees can work with vitality and in a healthy and energetic state of mind and body.

- Conducting workplace interviews by nurses
- Conducting interviews with industrial physicians for long-term employees is a key step in the hiring process.
- Providing information that supports disease prevention and health promotion.

■ The SDGs Festival



In November 2024, the 5th SDGs Festival in Nagoya Marunouchi was held at the Nagoya Tokio Marine & Nichido Building. Our company exhibited a booth titled "Respect the Law 38" and participated with the theme of "Promoting pedestrian priority and creating a society free of traffic accidents."

This time, we set up booths both indoors and outdoors. At the indoor venue, we explained the outline and concept of Respect 38 to visitors, as well as the meaning of the "Diamond Mark" painted before crosswalks.

At an outside setting, we exhibited an electric vehicle called SAKURA with the "RESPECT 38" logo wrapped around it. Various Sustainable Development Goals were also exhibited at other companies' booths, and the event proved to be a valuable source of information for us as well.



■ Official launch of new lease car service "unicar"

In April 2024, we officially launched "unicar," a pioneering service that utilizes data collected by telematics to perform inspections at the optimal timing based on mileage. The conventional inspection method involved periodic vehicle inspections, such as once every three months, which placed an unnecessary burden on customers when the mileage was low.

In response to these challenges, we conducted a comprehensive review of our existing services and developed "unicar," a sales approach centered on understanding the buyer's perspective—"It tales buyers' view to make sales."

This service has the potential to ease the burden on customers by reducing the time and effort required for inspections, thereby contributing to the promotion and revitalization of the maintenance industry.

■ Bicycle Safety Driving Seminar



In November 2024, we conducted a seminar on bicycle safety for technical trainees from China and Vietnam at our Toyota factory. The seminar was held in collaboration with the Bicycle Measures Team (B-Force) from the Toyota Police Department.

The instructions we received in the safety education course were presented in a manner that was accessible and easy to understand, utilizing panels as a visual aid. Comprehensive guidance on proper helmet-wearing techniques, effective bicycle-riding methods, and an in-depth overview of specific violations were also given. Additionally, we learned about the proposed strengthening of penalties for smartphone and drunk driving, which was set to be implemented starting in November 2024. Furthermore, the participants had the opportunity to learn about safety confirmation and bicycle operation during the practical session. The trainees expressed a heightened awareness of safe bicycle riding through the workshop, making it a very meaningful activity.

We will continue these efforts and provide ongoing support so that trainees can live comfortably in Japan.







■ Online Event "Respect 38"



In March of 2025, the Respect 38 online event, which is held regularly every year, was held live online again this year. Building on the success of the 2024 event, we organized a "Good Driving Contest," inviting participating companies to share video recordings showcasing their commitment to "pedestrian priority."

Additionally, we invited representatives from supporting companies to give presentations. These presentations included examples of their own activities and efforts to reduce accidents. This made this year's event a very meaningful and enjoyable one.



Promoting the Respect the Law 38: (Short Name: Respect 38)

(The objective is to disseminate the concept and implementation of prioritizing pedestrians.)

In an effort to share the idea and practice of Article 38 of the Road Traffic Act, which states "protect pedestrians crossing crosswalks," with the public, we launched the "Respect the Law38 Project." We are carrying out activities to promote understanding and dissemination of the "Three Concepts" and "Eight Action Guidelines."

■ 100-day Zero Accident Campaign



The 100 Days No Accident Campaign is an annual initiative aimed at fostering a society free from traffic accidents. By working in collaboration with participating companies, the campaign strives to achieve "no accidents." This initiative will mark its 13th iteration in 2024. The objective of this initiative is to achieve 100 days without accidents from September 12th to December 10th. This campaign has garnered the participation of companies from 999 departments.

The campaign was themed "Preventing accidents through KYT" Abbreviation of Japanese term: "Kiken Yochi Training" (KYT) is a program that involves the prediction of potential dangers. In our program, we provided posters with QR codes for KYT videos. To mark the conclusion of the campaign, we had the privilege of holding a certificate of appreciation ceremony and a special lecture meeting. In addition, starting in fiscal 2024, we launched a new initiative to support our customers in preventing accidents 365 days a year. We are committed to doing our utmost to contribute to preventing accidents for our customers through this activity.



■ In an effort to return to our fundamental principles, we have decided to change the name of the "Drivers Safety Service (DSS)" to the "Kimura Traffic Safety Center."

In order to eliminate traffic accidents for our valued customers, we have returned to our roots and are determined to work more honestly, faithfully, and sincerely than ever before. As of January 2025, we have changed the name of our Driver's Safety Service (DSS) to the Kimura Traffic Safety Center.



♦ Origin and Background of New Name

We began offering traffic disaster prevention services in 1967. At the time, companies and individuals with a high number of accidents were being denied insurance coverage. Seeing the trouble customers were in when they performed their own maintenance, our then-president, Akira Kimura, had a revolutionary idea: "If we can't get insurance because of an accident, then we should just prevent accidents from happening."

Driven by his conviction that "we want to eliminate accidents for our customers," he established the "Kimura Traffic Safety Center."

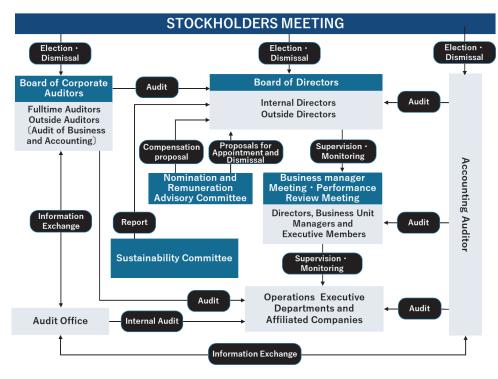

Board of Directors

Regular meetings of the Board of Directors are held once a month, and as required, a board meeting is held to supervise and monitor decision-making on management strategy and performance of duties.

Outside Directors

We have three outside directors out of the ten directors to supervise the Company's business execution with a high level of insight into management. Appointing outside directors, we strive to ensure the transparency of the Board of Directors and mutual management supervision between directors, and a thorough implementation of compliance.

Board of Auditors / Audit Office / Audit Firm

We have elected three outside corporate auditors in addition to one managing corporate auditor from our company to ensure thorough supervision of the execution of duties and to enhance auditing. We strive to improve the effectiveness of corporate governance by holding regular audit meetings of three parties, including Corporate Auditor, Audit Office, and Auditing Firm so as to exchange information on the status of audits from each standpoint.

Corporate Governance

Strengthening Corporate Governance

The corporate governance system has a hybrid intuitional design that combines management and monitoring functions organized by a nomination committee and a compensation committee in a company with a board of corporate auditors. The Company's Board of Directors makes important business decisions. We place the importance on high-quality decision-making by leveraging the knowledge and expertise of outside directors and outside corporate auditors. The Nomination and Compensation Committee, established to strengthen the supervisory function of the Board of Directors, has outside members as the majority, and the chairperson is also selected from outside the company.

At this point, we believe that the current system is optimal as it emphasizes management functions while also ensuring monitoring functions, as the Company has been working to strengthen corporate governance. From the perspective of further strengthening our monitoring functions, we are continually considering the optimal structure, including organizational design, the ratio of outside directors, the appointment of international directors, and increasing the ratio of female officers. The skills and experience possessed by our directors and auditors are indicated in the skill matrix below.

We will respond to ever changing diversified business environment by the board of directors with expertise and extensive experience of world excellence.

Corporate Governance Compliance

We review our compliance with the Corporate Governance Code at least once a year. In addition, we work to achieve compliance with all points of the Corporate Governance Code.

Risk Management • Compliance

Risk Management



In order to maximize corporate (Group) value and customer value in this rapidly changing business environment, we believe it is important to timely and appropriately identify the environment so as to respond to various risks. Within the Group, relevant departments conduct risk analyses and consider countermeasures for risks associated with major management decisions such as business reforms, establishment of new bases, including overseas bases, major investments and alliances. We also seek advice from relevant external organizations as required. In addition, a specialized department and staff members in charge from each division are involved in day-to-day risk management such as quality complaints and occupational accidents.

Securing Risk Management System

In accordance with the "Risk Management Regulations," we conduct risk management by holding regular meetings of the Risk Management Committee to examine and evaluate risks, formulate countermeasures, and check the status of countermeasures for each division and business unit.

In addition to developing and thoroughly disseminating the Business Continuity Plan (BCP), we conduct BCP-related

training such as safety confirmation drills, evacuation drills, and satellite mobile phone communication training. In light of the recent occurrence of cybersecurity incidents, we are promoting measures to strengthen security more than ever before through the establishment of internal rules, employee training, and the installation of various defense systems.

Compliance



In the midst of drastic changes in the environment surrounding our country, such as the development of corporate globalization and the diversification of government deregulation, we recognize that complying with laws and regulations, as well as thorough corporate ethics, are the foundation of our corporate activities.

Conducting a compliance seminar for executives and disseminating the materials for each individual seminar held at the local level ensures unity of purpose and compliance throughout the Group.

Internal Control System

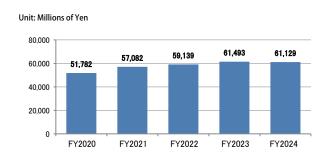

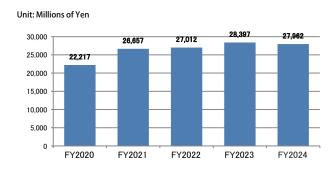
Changes in Return On Equity (ROE)



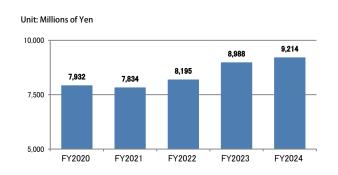
Changes in Price-to-book ratio (PBR)



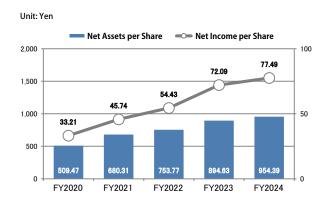
Changes in Status with Major Business Partners, etc.



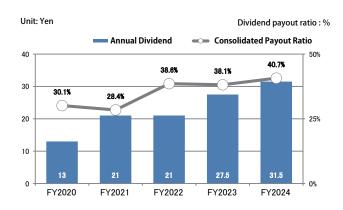
Status of NLS (New Logistics Services) Business



Changes in Net Assets and Net Income per Share



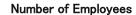

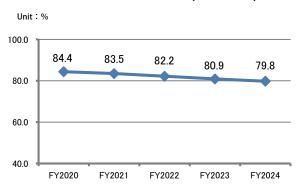




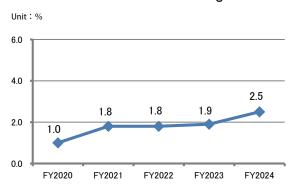
Average Length of Service



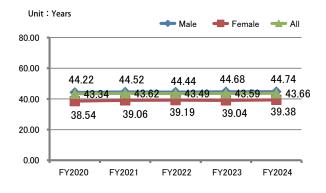

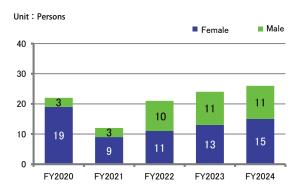

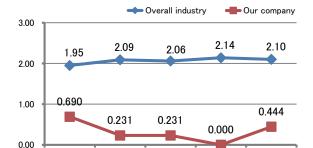
